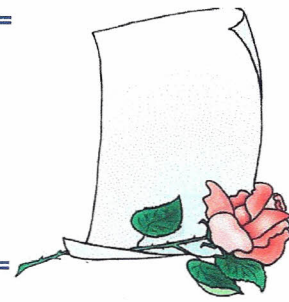


畢業生心聲

但中文學校的活動不單是比賽。我記得農曆新年時的舞獅表演很好看，鼓聲真是很大聲，氣氛很熱鬧。

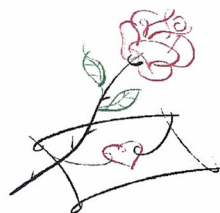
中秋節時也有很多豐富的食物給我們享用，老師又教我們做有趣的勞作，例如做燈籠。

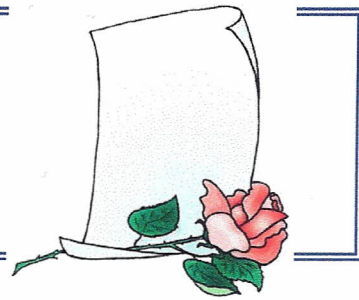
想起公公婆婆的笑容令我心中有一份溫暖。
